The Hague Prize for International Law 2009

In 2002 The Hague Prize for International Law was launched by The Hague Prize Foundation, The Hague, The Netherlands.

The prize will be awarded at least every two years to individual(s) and/or organizations who have made - through publications or achievements in the practice of law - a special contribution to the development of public international law, private international law or to the advancement of the rule of law in the world. The prize consists of a special medal and a monetary award of €50,000.00.

The first two recipients of the Prize were, respectively, Prof. Shabtai Rosenne (2004), because of his long and illustrious career as an eminent professor and distinguished diplomat and Prof. M. Cherif Bassiouni (2007), who made an important contribution to the rule of law by his work in the field of international criminal justice and his unswerving dedication to the creation of the International Criminal Court.

The Prize will be awarded for the third time in the summer of 2009. Nominations for the Prize will be accepted until August 15, 2008.

The Board of The Hague Prize Foundation hereby kindly invites anyone to nominate candidates (with a preference for individuals), who deserve such recognition for their contribution to international law.
