

International Bachelor of Law Program

The Hague University of Applied Sciences (THU) – member of The Hague Academic Coalition and a designated UNESCO School – offers over forty bachelor programs, master programs and post-academic courses in a wide range of professional fields. Over 18 thousand students pursue educations designed to develop their talents, to prepare them for professional careers and to share innovative knowledge with the various industries and society at large. In 2007, on the basis of Bynkershoek Institute research, and the Dutch Law Program (HBO-Rechten), the THU established a Dutch Government-licensed and accredited International Bachelor of Law Program (Program). The four-year Program has grown exceptionally since 2007. It currently has 300 students and 30 Faculty from 45 countries, and anticipates further significant growth in its next, fourth year of operation.

The full-time English-language Program, offers an education entirely focused on International, European and Comparative Principles of Law. It culminates in a LL.B. Degree and is structured to educate young legal professionals for work in the international (European) field. Students are progressively trained from the start to apply their knowledge on cases drawn from real life situations in individual assignments and group projects. The Faculty is recruited from a variety of legal backgrounds and builds upon the platform of The Hague as the “Legal Capital of the World”. The atmosphere is cordial, hard working and forward looking. Because of changes in the Faculty and increase of the student body the Program is in immediate need of a new

General Qualifications:

At least a completed Master of Law (LL.M.) exam or equivalent, including substantive knowledge on European law; at least five years working experience as a professional jurist (academic, judicial, other legal professions); proven ability and/or drive to contribute to knowledge transfer and student guidance in a task and competence oriented educational setting; excellent communication abilities and writing skills.

Specific Requirements:

Substantive expertise in European Law; willing to pick up already planned courses on EU Foreign Relations, and EU Fundamental Rights; willing to coordinate and give a few workshop-lectures on EU Migration Law; willing to ad-interim coordinate all European law courses (around 20 per year); and willing to serve as a Tutor, advising and coaching small groups of students on completion of assignments and academic success. The actual tasks and amount of days will depend on the candidate.

Appointment:

Employment conditions will be governed by the collective labor agreement (CAO) of the THU; initial gross salary is max. EUR 4.245 per month in case of a full-time appointment (plus 8% vacation allowance and 13th month). The actual salary will be based on individual qualifications, scope of responsibility and amount of days. Appointment will be for a one-year term initially, although the candidate will be immediately on track for permanent tenure.
